- (a) Final selection of the candidates will be done on the basis of marks secured in the CBT test only and as per the other applicable rules in case of tie.
- (b) In case of equal marks/tie marks in the CBT Test the merit will be decided based on the ranking in the various sub-sections of the subjects of CBT in progressive order. For example, sub section (i) will have higher priority than sub section (ii) and so on. In the event of all equality older candidates shall be placed at higher merit as per their Date of Birth.
